

On April 28 members of the American Postal Workers Union are joining millions of workers around the world in observing Workers Memorial Day.

This year, we are kicking off our campaign against one of the biggest safety challenges we face. Toxic work environments!

- Toxic workplaces hurt individual postal workers, who suffer effects on our mental and physical health.
- Toxic workplaces create physical hazards, as workers are unable to meaningfully report dangerous workplaces to managers who refuse to listen.
